

















AMERICA'S ATOMIC VETERANS

FROM THEIR (48 YEAR)

OATHS OF SECRECY

HAVING BEEN RELEASED FROM THEIR OATH'S OF SECRECY, ATOMIC VETERANS CAN NOW CLAIM THAT THEY WERE INVOLVED IN NUCLEAR WEAPONS TESTING EVENTS, THAT MAY HAVE RESULTED IN THEIR BEING EXPOSED TO IONIZING RADIATION **PARTICLES**

THIS IS ALL WELL AND GOOD HOWEVER: THERE ARE THOUSANDS OF ATOMIC VETERANS, ACROSS THE COUNTRY, WHO ARE NOT AWARE THAT THEY CAN NOW TELL ANYONE ABOUT THEIR PARTICIPATION IN NUCLEAR WEAPONS TESTS, WHILE ON ACTIVE DUTY.

THE BURDEN OF PROOF OF SUCH PARTICIPATION, HOWEVER, IS STILL THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ATOMIC VETERAN, WHO IS, IN MOST CASES, IN ILL HEALTH, NOT COMPUTER LITERATE, CANNOT FULLY UNDERSTAND, OR NEGOTIATE THE STACK OF FORMS REQUIRED BY THE D.V.A. WHEN FILING A CLAIM FOR COM-PENSATION OR MEDICAL CARE.

THEY ALSO FEEL THAT THEY ARE GROSSLY LIMITED IN THEIR ABILITY TO RECEIVE PROPER ASSISTANCE FROM V.A.M.C. MEDICAL PERSONNEL WHO MAY NOT BE FULLY INFORMED IN IONIZING RADIATION EXPOSURE HEALTH ISSUES.

NAAV HAS RECEIVED NUMBEROUS COMPLAINTS FROM ATOMIC VET'S WHO REPORTED FOR AN IONIZING RADIATION EXAM, ONLY TO BE ASKED A FEW QUESTIONS, THEN RELEASED. THE VAMC DID NOT PERFORM A COMPLETE EXAM, NOR DID THEY DO ANY BLOOD OR URANALYSIS TESTS, AS REQUIRED BY THEIR (VA FURNISHED) I. R. R. PROCEDURES MANUAL.
